

## Call for Papers

### ***Workshop for Early Career Scholars of the History and Culture of Polish Jews***

Beit Daniel, Zichron Ya'akov, Israel, 25-28 June 2018

The sixth Bi-Annual Poland-Israel Workshop on the History and Culture of Polish Jews will be hosted and organized by Bar-Ilan University and The Historical Society of Israel in cooperation with other academic institutions in Israel and in Poland.

The workshop will take place in Beit Daniel guest-house, Zichron Ya'akov, **from Monday, June 25 to Wednesday, June 28, 2018** and will include presentations by doctoral students and post-doctoral scholars, responses by senior scholars, discussions and cultural activities.

The program will begin with an opening event on Monday, June 25 and will be followed by three more days of presentations and discussions. Program organizers will be able to provide accommodation and board for the duration of the program.

Interested doctoral students and post-doctoral scholars should submit an application in English by email to The Historical Society of Israel ([tali@history.org.il](mailto:tali@history.org.il)) by no later than **January 31, 2018**.

Applications should consist of a single PDF file and include:

- A letter of interest
- A 1-2 page abstract of their research proposal
- A short CV
- A letter of recommendation by the student's supervisor which should be sent directly to the workshop organizers

Although the workshop is geared toward doctoral students and post-doctoral scholars affiliated with universities in Poland and Israel, students from other countries working on relevant topics are also encouraged to apply.
