<u>Call for Applications – Workshop and Publication Grants</u>

The Halpern Center for the Study of Jewish Self-Perception invites students and graduates of the Israel and Golda Koschitzky Department of Jewish History and Contemporary Jewry to apply to participate in an interactive workshop. The goal of the workshop is to help students prepare an article for publication in an academic journal. The workshop will be led by Prof. Debra Kaplan and will be held in November 2022.

Workshop Description: Students who are accepted to the workshop will be invited to present a chapter of their research and will receive feedback to help them further prepare their draft for submission to a journal. All participants are required to read the drafts prior to the workshop and to participate in an active and respectful manner. The number of participants is limited.

Grants: Students who are accepted to the workshop will be awarded a grant of up to 2500 NIS, to cover the cost of editing, translation, or rights for images. This sum will be available for up to six months after the workshop.

Any participant who does not read all of the drafts will be asked to leave the workshop and will be ineligible to receive a publication grant.

Who can apply?

- 1. Students who completed a Masters degree (in the thesis track) in the Koschitzky Department of Jewish History and Contemporary Jewry in the last three years, who earned a grade of 90 or above on their thesis
- 2. Doctoral students who are currently registered in the Koschitzky Department of Jewish History and Contemporary Jewry who wrote a thesis or the equivalent and earned a grade of 90 or above.
- 3. Graduates of the doctoral program in the Koschitzky Department of Jewish History and Contemporary Jewry who completed their degree in the last three years, and who earned a grade of 90 or above on their doctorate.

Application Instructions

- 1. Fill out the application form
- 2. Secure a short letter of recommendation from your thesis/doctoral advisor, which describes the chapter you have selected to present, its suitability for publication, and a recommendation for a journal to which you might submit the article. Applications are due by **September 1, 2022.** Incomplete applications will not be considered.
